JOHNSON CITY POLICE DEPARTMENT

MISSION STATEMENT

The mission of the Johnson City Police Department is the safeguarding of all citizens lives and property, the preservation of their constitutional rights, and to maintain a high standard of quality of life for all of Johnson City's residents and visitors. The police department will strive to develop a police service that meets unique neighborhood needs by combining law enforcement activities with progressive crime prevention strategies.

UNIFORM DIVISION

This division comprises the largest percentage of the police force and is the major crime prevention and enforcement branch of the department. It performs the basic functions in safeguarding the citizens of the community as well as the additional thousands who enter or pass through the community on a daily basis.

The Uniform Division is the first to respond to the citizen's call for assistance and the first to arrive at the scene of an occurrence necessitating police action. This division is a twenty-four hour per day operation, divided into platoons for each shift.

Most arrests and the greatest number of personal contacts with the public are made by the Uniform Patrol Officer as he patrols; controls traffic and enforces the Vehicle and Traffic and Penal laws.

The presence of a uniform Patrol Officer usually nullifies any criminal activity in the area due to the high profile of his uniform and the high visibility of his marked patrol unit. The success of the Uniform Division depends on the effectiveness of the patrol force.

DETECTIVE AND JUVENILE DIVISIONS

The Detective Division is responsible for the investigation of all serious crimes and, manpower permitting, the investigation of lesser crimes. The daily volume of new case assignments compels investigators to allocate their time on a priority basis, with the most serious crimes receiving first consideration. The extent of other investigations is determined by the circumstances involved, along with the amount of available time.

The basic purpose of the Detective Division is to investigate designated serious crimes in order to arrest, and convict the perpetrators, and recover stolen property. When the perpetrator has not been arrested, the Detective must analyze and integrate the information attained; continuing his investigation. His skill and ability; his background of experience, and his possession of many facts from similar or related investigations qualify him for his task.

To reach his objectives, he seeks the aid of experts in specialized fields; technicians, forensic specialists, etc., and couples this with his training, his developed knowledge of informants and his experience in dealing with a number of perpetrators. His investigation must be complete in every detail, to assure a successful prosecution and conviction when presented in a court of law.

The annual report also contains the activity results of the Juvenile Division. The success of this unit is incumbent upon specialized training received by the officers assigned. Along with this training goes experience garnered through contacts with the public in the course of the officer's career. This union of experience and training allows the officer to properly deal with juveniles, a special; and often time frustrating, task. They must be aware of child behavioral patterns; have an understanding of positive factors as well as anti-social behavior. Experience teaches insight into techniques and methods of handling children.

SUPPORT DIVISION

The Support Division of the Police department, staffed by its Secretaries, Meter personnel, and Maintenance personnel, can be equated to a lubricant which keeps an efficient machine in operation. It is responsible for providing all the materials keeping the operational end of the department functioning effectively on a 24 hour basis.

As the police task becomes more complex, the methods and technology of the Service Division, which supports the field forces by documentation of their activities, becomes more sophisticated and expeditious.

The workload generated by the field personnel necessitates swift, clear communication, dependable transportation and concise records keeping. For, without the keeping of the records, the accountability of any organization becomes null and void.

This unit is charged with developing systems and programs relative to maintaining statistical records, and further charged with the developing and distribution of analytical crime reports as directed and required by Federal, State, County and local mandates.

They maintain personnel and payroll records, inventories of equipment, records of departmental revenues and assist in the preparation of budgets.

The maintenance of property and equipment which provides for safe and dependable transportation is an integral part of this division. Equipment must be maintained at high levels, for instant use, as it may save the life of the officer and/or persons for whom the officer is providing service. The success of a modern day police operation relies heavily on the adequacy and vitality of its Service Division.

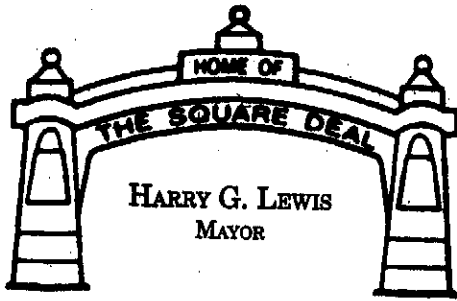
TRAFFIC DIVISION

The Traffic Division is responsible for the posting and monitoring of traffic signs, ordering and upkeep of Radar Units, Breathalyzer and Datamaster, the maintenance of all Fleet vehicles, and the ordering and replacement of emergency equipment used in Patrol Vehicles.

The traffic Division oversees special events that occur throughout the course of the year such as; the annual Holiday Parade, Memorial Day Parade, Homecoming Parade, Field Days, and Buckle Up New York seatbelt checkpoints.

The Traffic Division also oversees the Meter Division and the Crossing Guards that are posted throughout the Village.

The Traffic Division strives to ensure the safe passage of motorists and pedestrians throughout the Village.

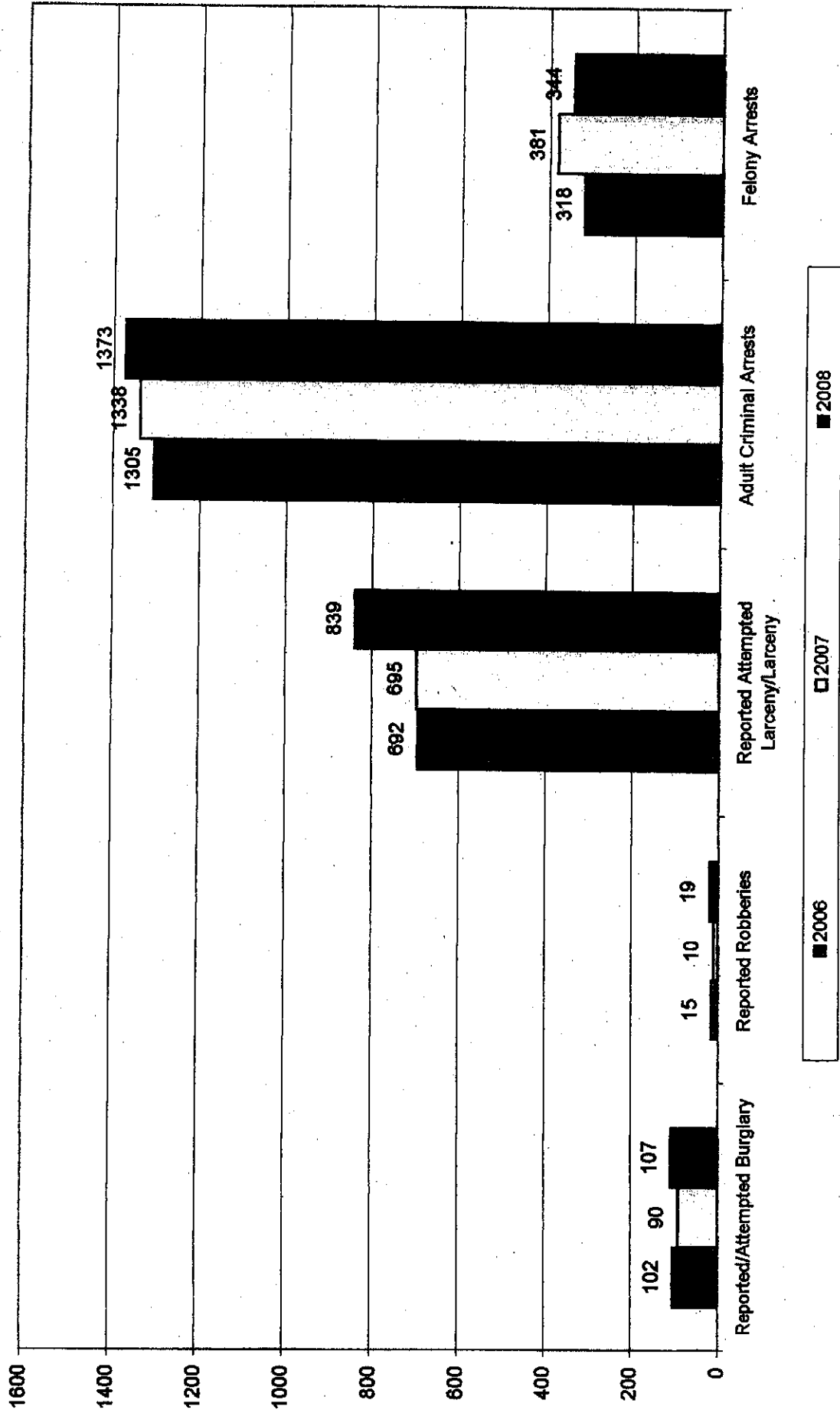
